## Medieval Matters Conference Lightening Research Presentation Contest

In the lightening research presentation contest, each presenter will have up to three minutes to give a verbal presentation providing an overview of their research in a concise and engaging way to a general audience. The contest will be held during the conference, during sessions 3 and 4 (all participants will be assigned to one of the two sessions). Each presentation is limited to a maximum of three minutes, challenging participants to convey the essence of their research succinctly and effectively. A panel of judges will evaluate the presentations on various presentation criteria and select the top three overall presenters who will be provided with monetary awards (1st place-\$100, 2nd place-\$75, and 3rd place-\$50). The scoring card to be used by the judges is attached.

## **Guidelines for presenters:**

- Each presentation must be given in 3 minutes. A visual timing signal will be given at the two-minute mark and an audible timing signal will sound at the three-minute mark. If a presenter is still speaking after three and half minute mark, the timer will interject so we can move on to the next presenter.
- The exact content of the presentation is up to the presenter, but the presentation should be focused on the highlights of the research.
- Due to the time constraints of the lightening presentations, no visual aids should be used in the presentations.
